

## The Life and Times of 'Flying Scotsman'

The book, a limited edition of 280 pages, tells the life history, in words and pictures, of Sir Nigel Gresley's Pacific locomotive ex GNR A1 1472, LNER A1/A3 4472, 502 & 103 and BR Class A3 60103 now approaching its centenary year.

It tells of the locomotive's working life from 1922 until withdrawal from BR in 1963, and its subsequent purchase by Alan Peglar. Its fateful trip to America is told in detail as is its tour of Australia. The locomotive has had various owners, all documented in the book, until, finally, being purchased by the NRM (York). The story of its restoration by the NRM and subsequent return to steam on the ELR and hence BR is told in detail. The history ends (?) as the locomotive enters Riley's workshops in Bury for overhaul for its centenary celebrations.

Appendices give technical details of the locomotive, and include the occasion of the British Empire Exhibition 1924, the first 100 m.p.h. run from Leeds, and various offshoots of the 'Flying Scotsman' brand, including vinyl recordings and models.
