Still, that's the fun of compiling tables such as many of the following. It takes effort, patience, exasperation and plenty of finger-in-the-air judgement moments. Just assume that there is no such thing as 'definitive' and all should be well with the world. Even if not definitive, they should be close – why not think of those where 'bets are hedged' as your own starting points for further research and verification (or otherwise)?
